**2. Voting at the AGM**

Voting on all of the Resolutions will be conducted by way of a poll, and not on a show of hands, in accordance with current recommended practice. This is a more transparent method of voting as shareholders' votes are counted according to the number of shares registered in their names rather than according to the votes of shareholders who attend the AGM.

**3. Action required**

If you would like to vote on the Resolutions and will not attend the meeting in person you may appoint another person as your proxy to exercise your rights to attend, speak and vote at the meeting by completing and returning the enclosed proxy form. **Full details on how to appoint a proxy are set out on pages 7 and 8 of this document.**

Completion and return of the proxy form will not prevent you from attending the AGM, nor any adjournment thereof, in person should you so wish.

**4. Recommendation**

The Directors believe that the Resolutions are in the best interests of the Company and are most likely to promote the success of the Company for the benefit of its members as a whole. Accordingly, the Board unanimously recommends that you vote in favour of all of the Resolutions as each Director intends to do in respect of their own beneficial holdings.

- (a) up to an aggregate nominal amount of £212,507 (such amount to be reduced by any allotments or grants made under paragraph (b) below in excess of such sum); and
- (b) to allot equity securities (within the meaning of section 560 of the Act) up to an aggregate nominal amount of £425,014 (such amount to be reduced by any allotments or grants made under paragraph (a) above) in connection with a fully pre-emptive offer:
  - (i) in favour of holders of Ordinary Shares in proportion (as nearly as may be practicable) to their existing holdings; and
  - (ii) to holders of other equity securities as required by the rights of those securities or, as the Directors otherwise consider necessary, but subject to such exclusions or other arrangements as the Directors may deem necessary or expedient to deal with treasury shares, fractional entitlements or legal, regulatory or practical problems arising under the laws or requirements of any overseas territory or by virtue of shares being represented by depository receipts or the requirements of any regulatory body or stock exchange or any other matter whatsoever,

provided that, unless previously revoked, varied or extended, this authority shall expire on the earlier of the date which is 15 months after the date of the passing of this Resolution and the conclusion of the next Annual General Meeting of the Company, except that the Company may, in each case, before such expiry, make an offer or agreement which would or might require Relevant Securities to be allotted after such expiry and the Directors may allot Relevant Securities in pursuance of any such offer or agreement as if this authority had not expired.

### 13. Disapplication of statutory pre-emption rights

That, if Resolution 12 is passed and in substitution for any equivalent authorities and powers granted to the Directors prior to the passing of this Resolution, the Directors be and they are empowered pursuant to section 570(1) of the Act to allot equity securities (as defined in section 560(1) of the Act) of the Company for cash pursuant to the authority of the Directors under section 551 of the Act conferred by Resolution 12 above, and/or by way of a sale of treasury shares for cash (by virtue of section 573 of the Act), in each case as if section 561(1) of the Act did not apply to such allotment or sale provided that such power shall be limited to:

- (a) the allotment of equity securities and sale of treasury shares for cash in connection with an offer of, or invitation to apply for, equity securities (but in the case of the authority granted under paragraph (b) of Resolution 12, by way of a fully pre-emptive offer only):
  - (i) in favour of holders of Ordinary Shares, where the equity securities respectively attributable to the interests of all such holders are proportionate (as nearly as practicable) to the respective number of Ordinary Shares held by them; and/or
  - (ii) to holders of any other equity securities as required by the rights of those securities or as the Directors otherwise consider necessary,

but subject to such exclusions or other arrangements as the Directors may deem necessary or expedient to deal with treasury shares, fractional entitlements, record dates or legal, regulatory or practical problems arising under the laws or requirements of any overseas territory or by virtue of shares being represented by depository receipts or the requirements of any regulatory body or stock exchange or any other matter whatsoever; and

- (b) in the case of an allotment of equity securities for cash pursuant to the authority granted by paragraph (a) of Resolution 12, the allotment of equity securities and/or sale of treasury shares (otherwise than under paragraph (a) of this Resolution) up to an aggregate nominal amount of £63,752; and
- (c) the allotment of equity securities or sale of treasury shares (otherwise than under paragraph (a) or paragraph (b) above) up to a nominal amount equal to 20% of any allotment of equity securities or sale of treasury shares from time to time under paragraph (b) above, such authority to be used only for the purposes of making a follow-on offer which the Directors determine to be of a kind contemplated by paragraph 3 of section 2B of the Statement of Principles on Disapplying Pre-Emption Rights most recently published by the Pre-Emption Group prior to the date of this notice,

provided that, unless previously revoked, varied or extended, this authority shall expire on the earlier of the date falling 15 months after the passing of this Resolution and the conclusion of the next Annual General Meeting of the Company, except that the Company may, before such expiry, make an offer or agreement which would or might require equity securities to be allotted (and treasury shares to be sold) after such expiry and the Directors may allot equity securities (and sell treasury shares) in pursuance of such an offer or agreement as if this authority had not expired.

### 14. Additional disapplication of pre-emption rights – acquisitions and/or investments

That, if Resolution 12 is passed, the Directors be authorised, in addition to any authority granted under Resolution 13, to allot equity securities (as defined in section 560(1) of the Act) for cash under the authority given by that Resolution and/or to sell Ordinary Shares held by the Company as treasury shares for cash as if section 561 of the Act did not apply to any such allotment or sale, such authority to be limited to:

- (a) the allotment of equity securities or sale of treasury shares up to an aggregate nominal amount of £63,752, such authority to be used only for the purposes of financing (or refinancing, if the authority is to be used within 12 months after the original transaction) a transaction which the Directors determine to be either an acquisition or a specified capital investment of a kind contemplated by the Statement of Principles on Disapplying Pre-Emption Rights most recently published by the Pre-Emption Group prior to the date of this notice; and
- (b) the allotment of equity securities or sale of treasury shares (otherwise than under paragraph (a) above) up to a nominal amount equal to 20% of any allotment of equity securities or sale of treasury shares from time to time under paragraph (a) above, such authority to be used only for the purposes of making a follow-on offer which the Directors determine to be of a kind contemplated by paragraph 3 of section 2B of the Statement of Principles on Disapplying Pre-Emption Rights most recently published by the Pre-Emption Group prior to the date of this notice,

provided that, unless previously revoked, varied or extended, this authority shall expire on the earlier of the date falling 15 months after the date of the passing of this Resolution and the conclusion of the next Annual General Meeting of the Company, except that the Company may, before such expiry, make an offer or agreement which would or might require equity securities to be allotted or sold after such expiry and the Directors may allot equity securities in pursuance of such an offer or agreement as if this authority had not expired.

## Explanation of business

### To be proposed at the 2026 AGM

#### Resolution 1: 2025 Annual Report

In accordance with section 437 of the Act, Directors must present the accounts of the Company, together with the report of the Directors and report of the Company's auditor for the year ended 31 December 2025 to shareholders at the AGM. These are contained within the 2025 Annual Report.

For shareholders who have elected to receive a hard copy, the 2025 Annual Report is enclosed with this Notice of AGM. Copies of the 2025 Annual Report may be obtained by shareholders at any time, either in hard or electronic form, upon written request without charge to Computershare Investor Services PLC, The Pavilions, Bridgwater Road, Bristol BS99 6ZY or can be found on the Company's website at [www.propertyfranchise.co.uk/investor-relations](http://www.propertyfranchise.co.uk/investor-relations).

#### Resolutions 2 to 8: Re-election of Directors

Resolutions 2 to 8 relate to those Directors who are seeking re-election at the AGM in accordance with the Company's articles of association and the relevant provisions of the Quoted Companies Alliance's Corporate Governance Code 2023.

#### Resolutions 9 and 10: Re-appointment and remuneration of auditor

The Company is required to appoint an auditor at each Annual General Meeting at which accounts are laid, to hold office until the conclusion of the next Annual General Meeting. Resolution 9, which is recommended by the Audit and Risk Committee, proposes the re-appointment of BDO LLP as the auditor of the Company. Resolution 10 follows best practice in corporate governance by separately seeking authority for the Directors to determine the remuneration of the auditor.

#### Resolution 11: Declaration of 2025 final dividend

The Company requires shareholder approval to pay a final dividend, the amount of which shall not exceed the amount recommended by the Board. The Board recommends a final dividend of 15 pence per Ordinary Share in issue bringing the total dividend for the financial year ended 31 December 2025 to 22 pence per Ordinary Share in issue. If approved, the final dividend will be paid on 1 June 2026 to shareholders recorded in the Company's Register of Members on 8 May 2026.

#### Resolution 12: Authority to allot shares

Resolution 12 seeks to renew the authority for the Directors to allot shares. Under section 551 of the Act the Directors are, with certain exceptions, unable to allot shares in the Company or grant rights to subscribe for, or convert any security into, shares in the Company unless they are authorised to do so by the Company's shareholders in a general meeting.

The authority conferred on the Directors at last year's Annual General Meeting under section 551 of the Act to allot shares expires on the date of the forthcoming AGM. Accordingly, Resolution 12 seeks new authority under section 551 of the Act to authorise the Directors to allot shares in the Company or grant rights to subscribe for, or convert any security into, shares in the Company. If approved, this authority will expire on the earlier of the date which is 15 months after the passing of this Resolution and the conclusion of the Company's next Annual General Meeting.

In accordance with the current guidelines issued by the Investment Association, paragraph (a) of Resolution 12 authorises the Directors to allot shares or grant rights to subscribe for, or to convert any security into, such shares in the Company up to an aggregate nominal amount of £212,507 being an amount equal to one-third of the Company's existing issued Ordinary Share capital (excluding treasury shares) as at 17 March 2026 (being the latest practicable date prior to publication of the Notice of AGM). Paragraph (b) of Resolution 12 authorises the Directors to allot equity securities in connection with an offer by way of a fully pre-emptive offer to holders of equity securities up to an aggregate nominal amount of £425,014 (as reduced by the nominal amount of any shares issued under paragraph (a) of Resolution 12), being two-thirds of the Company's existing issued Ordinary Share capital (excluding treasury shares) as at 17 March 2026 (being the latest practicable date prior to publication of the Notice of AGM).

#### Resolution 13: Disapplication of statutory pre-emption rights

Section 561 of the Act imposes restrictions on the issue of equity securities (as that term is defined in the Act and which includes the Company's Ordinary Shares) which are, or are to be, paid up wholly in cash and not first offered to existing shareholders. Accordingly, Resolution 13 grants the Directors general authority to allot and sell equity securities covered by the Resolution 12 authority for cash as if section 561 of the Companies Act 2006 did not apply, provided that this power is limited to (a) the allotment and sale to holders of Ordinary Shares or other equity securities on a pre-emptive basis but with appropriate adjustments to the statutory pre-emption requirements set out in the Act, for example to deal with fractional entitlements and overseas legal requirements, as the Directors see fit; (b) the allotment or sale (otherwise than pursuant to (a)) of equity securities on a non-pre-emptive basis up to a maximum nominal value of £63,752, representing approximately 10% of the Company's existing issued Ordinary Share capital (excluding treasury shares) as at 17 March 2026 (being the latest practicable date prior to publication of the Notice of AGM); and (c) the allotment or sale (otherwise than pursuant to (a) and (b)) of equity securities on a non-pre-emptive basis up to 2% of the Company's existing issued Ordinary Share capital (excluding treasury shares) as at 17 March 2026 (being the latest practicable date prior to publication of the Notice of AGM), to be used only for the purposes of making a follow-on offer to existing holders of securities not allocated shares under (a) and (b) above.

Unless renewed, revoked, varied or extended, this authority will expire on the earlier of the date which is 15 months after the passing of this Resolution and the conclusion of the Company's next Annual General Meeting.

Resolution 13 is in line with the Pre-Emption Group's Statement of Principles for the Disapplication of Pre-Emption Rights which were updated on 4 November 2022.

## Explanation of business continued

To be proposed at the 2026 AGM

### Resolution 14: Additional disapplication of pre-emption rights – acquisitions and/or investments

In addition to Resolution 13, the Directors believe that there may be other circumstances when it is in the best interests of the Company to allot new Ordinary Shares either on an entirely non-pre-emptive basis or in a way that departs from the statutory requirements set out in the Act.

Accordingly, Resolution 14 grants the Directors general authority to allot and sell equity securities covered by the Resolution 13 authority for cash as if section 561 of the Act did not apply, provided that this power is limited to (a) the allotment or sale of equity securities on a non-pre-emptive basis up to a maximum nominal value of £63,752, representing approximately 10% of the Company's existing issued Ordinary Share capital (excluding treasury shares) as at 17 March 2026 (being the latest practicable date prior to publication of the Notice of AGM); and used only for the purposes of financing (or refinancing, if the authority is to be used within 12 months after the original transaction) a transaction which the Board determines to be an acquisition or other capital investment (of a kind contemplated by the Statement of Principles on Disapplying Pre-Emption Rights most recently published by the Pre-Emption Group prior to the date of this notice); and (b) the allotment or sale (otherwise than pursuant to (a) and (b)) of equity securities on a non-pre-emptive basis up to 2% of the Company's existing issued Ordinary Share capital (excluding treasury shares) as at 17 March 2026 (being the latest practicable date prior to publication of the Notice of AGM); to be used only for the purposes of making a follow-on offer to existing holders of securities not allocated shares under (a) and (b) above.

Resolution 14 is in line with the Pre-Emption Group's Statement of Principles for the Disapplication of Pre-Emption Rights which were updated on 4 November 2022, the template resolutions published by the Pre-Emption Group in 2022 and the Share Capital Management Guidelines published by the Investment Association (as updated in February 2023).

### Resolution 15 – Authority to purchase Company's own shares

Pursuant to Article 11.1 of the Company's articles of association, the Company may from time to time purchase its own shares subject to statutory requirements. Such purchases must be authorised by the shareholders at a general meeting. This Resolution seeks to grant the Directors authority earlier of the date which is 15 months after the date of the passing of this Resolution and the conclusion of the next Annual General Meeting of the Company, unless such authority is revoked or renewed prior to such time, to make market purchases of the Company's own Ordinary Shares, up to a maximum of 6,375,201 Ordinary Shares, being an amount equal to 10% of the Company's existing issued Ordinary Share capital as at 17 March 2026 (being the latest practicable date prior to publication of the Notice of AGM). The maximum price payable is an amount equal to 105% of the average of the middle market quotations for an Ordinary Share for the 5 business days immediately preceding the date of purchase and the minimum price is the nominal value of one penny per share.

Although the Directors have no current intention to make such purchases, they consider that it is in the best interests of the Company and its shareholders to keep the ability to make market purchases of the Company's own shares in appropriate circumstances, without the cost and delay of a general meeting. The authority would only be exercised if the Directors believe the purchase would enhance earnings per share and be in the best interests of shareholders generally.

The Company may hold in treasury any of its own shares that it purchases in accordance with the authority conferred by this Resolution. This would give the Company the ability to re-issue treasury shares quickly and cost effectively and would provide the Company with greater flexibility in the management of its capital base.

### Resolution 16: Directors' Remuneration Policy

In accordance with the Quoted Companies Alliance's Corporate Governance Code 2023, Resolution 16 invites shareholders to vote on the Directors' Remuneration Policy, the details of which are set out in the Report of the Remuneration Committee included in the 2025 Annual Report on pages 50. This vote is advisory and does not affect the Company's ability to implement the Directors' Remuneration Policy.

### Resolution 17: Directors' Remuneration Report

In accordance with the Quoted Companies Alliance's Corporate Governance Code 2023, Resolution 17 invites shareholders to vote on the Directors' Remuneration Report for the year ended 31 December 2025 which can be found on pages 49 to 52 (inclusive) of the 2025 Annual Report (excluding the Remuneration Policy). This vote is advisory only and the Directors' entitlement to remuneration is not conditional on this Resolution being passed.

## Notes to the Notice of Annual General Meeting

### Entitlement to vote

1. Only those members registered on the Company's Register of Members at:
  - a. 6.00 p.m. on 26 May 2026; or
  - b. if the AGM is adjourned, at 6.00 p.m. on the day 2 days prior to the adjourned meeting, shall be entitled to vote at the AGM.

### Appointment of proxies

2. If you are a member of the Company at the time set out in note 1.a. above, you are entitled to appoint a proxy to exercise all or any of your rights to attend, speak and vote at the AGM and you should have received a proxy form with this Notice of AGM. You can appoint a proxy using the procedures set out in these notes and the notes to the proxy form.
3. A proxy does not need to be a member of the Company but must attend the AGM to represent you. Details of how to appoint the Chair of the meeting or another person as proxy using the proxy form are set out in the notes to the proxy form. If you wish your proxy to speak on your behalf at the AGM you will need to appoint your choice of proxy (not being the Chair) and give your instructions to them.
4. You may appoint more than one proxy provided each proxy is appointed to exercise rights attached to different shares. You may not appoint more than one proxy to exercise rights attached to any one share. To appoint more than one proxy, please contact the Company's Registrar, Computershare Investor Services PLC, to request additional proxy forms.
5. A vote withheld is not a vote in law, which means that the vote will not be counted in the calculation of votes for or against a Resolution. If no voting indication is given, your proxy will vote or abstain from voting at his or her discretion. Your proxy will vote (or abstain from voting) as he or she thinks fit in relation to any other matter which is put before the AGM.

### Appointment of proxy using hard copy proxy form

6. The notes to the proxy form explain how to direct your proxy to vote on each Resolution or to withhold their vote.

To appoint a proxy using the proxy form, the form must be;

- completed and signed;
- sent or delivered to Computershare Investor Services PLC at The Pavilions, Bridgwater Road, Bristol BS99 6ZY; and
- received by Computershare Investor Services PLC no later than 10.00 a.m. on 26 May 2026 or, if the AGM is adjourned, by no later than 48 hours prior to the adjourned meeting.

In the case of a member which is a company, the proxy form must be executed under its common seal or signed on its behalf by an officer of the company or an attorney of the company.

Any power of attorney or any other authority under which the proxy form is signed (or a duly certified copy of such power or authority) must be included with the proxy form.

### Appointment of proxy by joint members

7. In the case of joint holders, where more than one of the joint holders purports to appoint a proxy, only the appointment submitted by the most senior holder will be accepted. Seniority is determined by the order in which the names of the joint holders appear in the Company's Register of Members in respect of the joint holding (the first-named being the most senior).

### Changing proxy instructions

8. To change your proxy instructions simply submit a new proxy appointment using the methods set out above.

If you submit more than one valid proxy appointment, the appointment received last before the latest time for the receipt of proxies will take precedence.

### Termination of proxy instructions

9. In order to revoke a proxy instruction you will need to inform the Company by sending a signed hard copy notice clearly stating your intention to revoke your proxy appointment to Computershare Investor Services PLC, The Pavilions, Bridgwater Road, Bristol BS99 6ZY. In the case of a member which is a company, the revocation notice must be executed under its common seal or signed on its behalf by an officer of the company or an attorney of the company. ### Voting

16. Voting on all Resolutions will be conducted by way of a poll.

If any votes are counted which ought not to have been counted, or might have been rejected, the error shall not vitiate the Resolution unless it is pointed out at the same meeting, or at an adjournment, and it is, in the opinion of the Chair of the meeting, of sufficient magnitude to vitiate the Resolution.
